This course is encompassed three comprehensive interconnected curricular areas such as a) Perspectives in Education b) Curriculum and pedagogic studies and c) Engagement with the field.

Engagement with the Field is intended to connect all the courses across the programme. It also contains special courses for Improving Professional Capacities of the student teachers. Transaction of the curriculum is to be done by means of a variety of approaches, such as, group presentations, projects, case studies, discussions on reflective journals, observations, and interactions with the community in different socio cultural surroundings.

Art and Aesthetic, yoga, health and physical education are also have has a significant place in the present curriculum. Having acquired some experience with the child, the community and schools in first year, the second year would suggest rigorous engagement with the school in the form of School Internship. Before Internship there is an induction programme for the student-teachers to understand the school in totality. School Internship shall be designed to lead to the progress of a comprehensive repertoire of perspectives, professional capacities, and skills. Student teachers shall be equipped to provide to varied needs of learners in schools. Internship in schools is to be done for a minimum duration of 15 weeks. It is important that the student-teachers combine and reflect on their experiences in-between and after the school internship.

M.Ed Programme:

The chief push of the 2 year M.Ed programme of NCTE is the professional training of teacher educators through the development of skills related to independent study of research, academic writing, communication and team work.

The curriculum consists of four elements such as (i) Perspective courses; (ii) Tool courses (iii) Teacher Education component and (iv) Specializations. Perspective courses consist of the following five components: a) Introduction to Education studies b) Philosophy of education, c) Psychology of education d) Sociology, History and Political Economy courses and f) Curriculum studies.

REVISED B.Ed. CURRICULUM OF UNIVERSITY OF KERALA

As per the above guidelines given by NCTE and other documents university of Kerala prepared curriculum for B Ed and M Ed courses the board of studies in education of university of Kerala organised a one day workshop at Mar Theophilus Training college on Thursday the 12th of February 2015 to discuss the revised NCTE curriculum for teacher education. Under the leadership of Dr. Santhosh Kumar (Chairman, BOS, Education), the members of BOS, faculty and subject coordinators participated in the programme. Dr. K.Y. Benedict (member board of studies), Dr. Maya.S (Subject Committee Coordinator) of Mar Theophilus Training college participated in the discussions. By periodic meetings and discussions the team formulated and prepared a curriculum and started implementing in the academic year 2014-2015.

Curriculum Vision envisages the "Empowerment of prospective teachers with a value embedded and competency-based teacher education curriculum, to equip them to be professionally competent, flexible and

socially dedicated to meet the challenges in a knowledge society". The main objectives behind present curriculum are to identify and resolve the main social, environmental and class room challenges of our pluralistic knowledge society and make use of the knowledge in nurturing and equipping the classroom learner to face those challenges by acquiring relevant attitudes, competencies and skills.

The curriculum prescribes Guiding Principles, Curriculum Vision, Vision Highlights, General Objectives of B.Ed. Course, Regulations for the B. Ed. Course, Definition of Terms, Course Outline, Structure of the B. Ed. Course, Curriculum Framework, Credit details of the Course, Details of theory courses, Semester- I, II, III, IV, Details of Practical work associated with theory - CE, Details of Practical Courses/Related Practical work, Guidelines for Practical work, Strategies of Learner Assessment, Grading System, Modes of Curriculum Transaction, Curriculum Orientation, and Composition of the Curriculum, in semester 1, 2, 3 and 4.

COMPOSITION OF THE CURRICULUM

The present curriculum contains theoretical and practical aspects of Philosophical and Sociological Perspectives of Knowledge and Curriculum; Developmental Perspectives of the Learner, Technology and Communication in Education, Education in Indian Society, Perspectives of Learning and Teaching, Assessment in Education, Learner in the Educational Perspective and Theoretical Base of subject Education and Pedagogic Content Knowledge Analysis. In the 4th semester there is an online test based on Advanced Studies in Perspectives in Education and Advanced Studies in Curriculum and Pedagogic Courses.

The curriculum includes the best practices of the teacher training programme and it incorporates the present educational rational and modern progresses in pedagogical practices with Problem Based Practicum and Reflective practices. The present revision announces a credit based semester approach in the Teacher Education curriculum at the Under-Graduate level. In the restructured curriculum, introduction of Teacher Pedagogic Content Knowledge Analysis (TPCKA) occupies a noticeable change from the previous curriculum. Another noteworthy phase in the present curriculum is the drive given for Evidence Based Continuous Assessment as per Competency Based Performance Indicators. The curriculum includes all practices like art and aesthetics, life skill and soft skill training, personality development programmes, socio-cultural activities, eco-ethics, citizenship training programme, health education etc. for the all round development of prospective teachers.

Former Indian President Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam gives all recognition to his teachers for his remarkable accomplishment either being a Scientist or the Prime Minister of India. Today many bureaucrats and political leaders attempt to judge teachers in terms of money, power and position. They think teaching is a simple job, which can be done by everybody. Of course, some teachers think teaching is their job, not life, educational institutions are recreation centre, not the temple of making noble scholars. The famous poet of India Kalidasa said, "If the teacher's scholarship is just earning bread, then he is not better than a shopkeeper selling knowledge".
