


SPARKZ-19 EXPOSITION OF TALENTS

Editorial

My association with John sir came in an end on 12.12.2020 at 10.30 pm. I promised him that I would return the next day. Return I did but by then he had gone in his heavenly abode at 5.30 am.

His fine sense of justice and the principled stand he always took made him different in his entire career. He was always under challenges. He was truly the best teacher, a teacher par excellence. A teacher more committed in his duty towards his students I have not come across. His classes were an intellectual treat. They were lessons not just for exams but for life. His jokes, stories, anecdotes and examples from everyday life are green in the memories of his students. Even though he was the most qualified person at a point in the history of Mar Theophilus Training College to be its head he never aspired for the administrative post as it was not his cup of tea.

He was not only a teacher but also a mentor and guru for his students. In fact, I knew a former student of his who says he was for her the real 'guru' and God spoke to her through him whenever she needed guidance. As one who was fortunate to stay with him at his house for three years, I saw many of the former students coming to visit him and for them it seemed to be a pilgrimage.

Fourteen years of sanctity training has left an indelible mark on his personality. The vow of poverty which he took when he was a member of S.V.D. congregation he kept till the very end of his life. He used to help many financially but was very reluctant to spend money on himself.

He was an ideal student. He bagged first rank for B.Ed. from the University of Kerala and first rank for M.Ed. from PUNE University. His Ph.D. thesis "Explanation of Explanations" was sent abroad for valuation and one examiner made special mention of the highest standard of the language besides the exceptional quality of the content. The thesis is the best proof of his analytical mind.

The word procrastination was not in his dictionary. I always felt that he never experienced any tension in any examination hall. For every exam he was ready at least two days before the actual examination. It was not only with the examination but with every assignment he ever took up, be it small or great. Once he agreed to do something, he would start working on it straight away and he would rest only once it was finished.

He has written many sweet and sweet books in Malayalam. "Hazard nucleotides are sweet but . . . well in this case the unpublished ones are better than the published ones. 'Maanamadil' was published by him two years before his death. As per the original plan only 100 copies were to be printed and they were to be given to his dear and near ones as his parting gift. Encouraged him to increase the number to 200 and then to 250. Almost all the copies have been distributed. Many have spoken very highly of the book.

He has prepared a lecture on 'Concentration'. I wish and pray that it will see daylight at the earliest since it would surely help many in their life. He had clear premonition of his approaching death and he made it clear to those who were visiting him. He died but he lives in the hearts of his students.

NINE DAYS -AROUND OUR INDIA



As per the suggestion of E-ayara team, we 94 students and 5 teachers embarked on our journey to North India on 3rd March. The faculty members accompanied us were Dr. Joju John, Dr. Anny A. S, Dr. Neema Thomas, Mr. Nethaneen J.P and Mr. Sabin Lal - boarded the Kerala Express with so much enthusiasm and 'packages of home-made yummy foods'. The Forty-eight-hour long journey sitting in a train surely taught us a lot to share food responsibly, to be a companion to the frightened soul, to be brave, to be selfless and not to touch our face every minute. As we passed across the terrains of different states there were vendors selling different varieties of fruits which we purchased in bulk and munched up together. Whenever we were aware about the wave of corona virus, quickly armed ourselves with masks and sanitizers.

On March 5th, we reached Agra Cantorment and checked into the hotel, and then visited Agra Fort and Taj Mahal. The two sister monuments were really beyond words. We could see Taj Mahal from Agra Fort. Agra Fort architecture was simply superb and there was a special place worth highlighting a sort of balcony from which the Taj Mahal appeared far away if we went nearer and seemingly comes closer if we move away. We fail to understand what sort of optical illusion that was or whether it belongs to a real magic of architecture. This thought intensified when we reached the Taj Mahal by the cool and pristine banks of the Yamuna river. Taj mahal's beauty had moved not only many great poets like Rabindranath Tagore, Rudyard Kipling but also each one of us. The next day entered the city of Jaipur - the pink city. Almost all the major buildings were made up of red sandstones for e.g. - Amber Fort which was scattered over the hills. The wall paintings using natural colours, the symmetrical arcs, the natural cooling system, the designs engraved on the floors and walls were outstanding but nothing in front of the Mirror Palace. We then went to the City Palace and then to the historic Jantar Mantar Observatory which showed us many astronomical devices of calculations of the ancient era and also an ancient dial of showing time with the help of shadows. These things added to our amazement and at last we glimpsed how the Jel mahal shone like god on a watery platform. Then we also took photos in the background of Hawa Mahal. On March 7th, we reached the capital city of India and visited tall five storied tower Qutub Minar, the richly ornamented columns on the sides, the iron pillar and ruined arcs, a UNESCO world heritage site and the tallest bulding in the world made of bricks energized us. The closing day was a Sunday and coincidentally our first monument to visit was Gol Dak Khana Church, which is one of the oldest churches. Then we had a glance the Parliament House and Rashtrapati Bhawan. Then visited India Gate with our martyrs' names engraved on it and Nehru museum-Humayun's tomb which was built for Humayun by his wife in the model of Taj Mahal-Indira Gandhi museum and the photos took us through her life. Raj Ghat made us emotional. Red Fort was more or less like a combination of Agra fort and Amber Fort with a mini bazaar inside it. A beautiful evening at the Akshardham where different types of flowers, diverse forms of Swami Narayan and also stories are carved into the ceilings using Laser Techniques out of our breadth. This journey has taken us not only through places but also through time.

On 9th March morning, we boarded back to home city by the Nizamuddin Train. Now we feel it was a really an effective assessment by our principal who had declared that the trip is compulsory for all which scooped away all scopes for any creative excuses by any of us.
